

More than \$500,000 in wildfire relief has flowed through the Rocky Mountain Community Relief Fund and into the community—thanks to the generosity of donors and the trust placed in us to steward it well.

Thanks to a leadership pledge from Calgary Foundation to cover BCF's administrative costs, we were able to assure donors that 100% of every gift would flow to Jasperites impacted by the fire.

But the real story isn't just the total. It's how the funds moved—and who they empowered.

We partnered with the Jasper Community Team Society (JCTS), a long-standing, deeply trusted local organization. Through this partnership, wildfire relief funds supported:

- Emergency housing and temporary shelter for displaced families
- Food and essentials for residents living in hotels, RVs, or with friends
- Outreach and wellness services
 to help people process trauma
- Operational capacity so JCTS could scale up for the long haul




